1st Dec 1860.

Dear George — By the last mail I received yours of the 11th ulto. It which says you say that South Carolina will secede and that all the Cotton States, will follow on or before the 1st March next. You thus say "If they do. What course will you pursue?" I would like an answer to this question and if you will be governed by circumstances tell me what they are. You being an officer of the Army & am particularly to hear from you what course you will pursue in case of a Secession of the Southern States!

Your questions are so comprehensive that, in order to give you a clear idea of my views and intentions to state my convictions, inclinations and intentions somewhat in detail.

In the first place I have no sympathy with sectional parties North or South - the Abolition and Secession parties are the natural growth of each other; yet I cannot but acknowledge that the South has just cause of complaint. The North has elected Lincoln upon a sectional platform pledged to carry

outwards "irrepressible conflict" and have
nullified the laws of Congress enacted to
protect Southern Rights - have made a
war upon the interests and domestic insti-
tutions of the Slave States. All this I do
not consider ~~not~~ sufficient cause for
Rebellion for Secession until
we seek Redress and protection by legal
means and within the Union. Deception
should be the Ultimo Ratio quantum. Rebellion
against tyranny I consider justified by T-
ruth, when all other means of redress have
been tried. I believe we can get redress
within the Union & it is demanded it legally
but earnestly and steadily if we fail we
can appeal to the God of battles feeling
justified before God and having the
sympathies of the civilized world. Until
we make that appeal it is my duty
as an officer of the Army and as a
citizen of the United States to be loyal
to the best Government and to obey all
legal and proper orders. That Genl Lincoln
has been Constitutionally elected the President
of the Union - it is our duty to see him
inaugurated - the South should insist upon
this - Should this violate his oath of office
insist upon his being punished - should
he abuse his powers to oppress the South -

though constitutionally we are absolved from
our allegiance and rebellion becomes a
sacred duty shown us fair in getting
Redress. While ye show ourselves a land-
abiding people who should unitedly
demand Redress - we would give it - we have
in the free States more conservative voters
than all the voters of the Slave states.

If you may ask how we are to proceed - I
leave that to wiser and more experienced
heads than mine. I prefer a convention
to amend the Constitution. Virginia, Kentucky
and Tennessee - the three great conservative
states of the Union should call together
their legislatures and act in concert to
Save the Union and protect every section
from oppression - if necessary let them do
this armed to the teeth.

All my blood are South - My home is South
My interests and inclinations are South.
I believe that Slavery is a blessing to the
Negro yet I should be sorry to see a
separate Republic established upon
the sole idea of Negro Slavery. Tennessee
is my home and never would I draw
my sword against her - when she is
defending her rights. Soon would I return
my commission to the President and
retire to my mountain home and

labor for my daily bread - neither
would I feel justified in my own eyes
should I for office sake allow myself
to be used against my neighbors in
an unjust cause - yet I feel it a duty
to shrink from no duty that the honor
or interest of the Union demands -

I should never willingly see Northern
troops sent to coerce the South -

Now as to what I will do I shall
stand by the Union as long as I can
do so with honor and the Union answers
the purposes for which it was instituted
then I can no longer serve the Union
they approval of my own conscience &
I shall return my commission to
the President - return home a
a Rebel. I should there be a separable
Separation I go with my State - When
my state wants my services I shall
be on stand - As to circumstances
we have to be governed by them -
what these circumstances may happen
to be I cannot foresee - events in these
troubled times come upon us unawares -
I believe I can safely say that I do not
