Knoxville Register, 17 Oct. 1820: Sale Adonijah's Ramboe's undivided int. in & to 312 A. land County of Sevier on Boyd's Creek, adjoin. lands Matthias Link & others; which sd. A. Rambo holds & claims right & title to as heir at law; formerly owned by his father Jacob Rambo; also sd. A. Rambo's int. & sd. 312 A. that he holds & claims by purchase from the widow Rambo & others who had title to sd. tract which was levied on to satisfy a judgment that Brabson & McAlister recovered against sd. Rambo in county court of Sevier County.
