"I do hereby nominate and appoint Wislon P. Roberts my attorney in fact for me and in my name to sell and convey to any person or persons their heirs and assigns forever who will purchase the same by general warranty deed in one Tract of Lans as he may think best all my right title claim and interest in a certain Tract of land belonging to Samuel Stockton deceast lying in the state of Tennessee Sevier County on French Broad river adjoining the Lands of Allen Bryan Deceast. & Samuel Henry Deceast and all the right title and claim I have in the estate of Engeline Stockton deceast and I do hereby authorize and empower the said Roberts his agent or attorney to collect all moneys due me from the estate of Samuel Stocton deceast and also all the moneys due me of the estate of Engeline Stockton deceast and take and receive the consideration, money or take notes for the same at his discretion he may also bring and prossecute in my name any suit that may be necessary to gain possession of or establish my title to the same employ such councils or other aid as he may need at my expence and charge and I do hereby ratify and confirm any act or thing he may lawfully do in the premises as fully as if I were present and doing the same my self this 22d day of December 1842.
